Elvis Presley chosen for 1993 postage stamp

Elvis Presley will get his own U.S. postage stamp next year as one of five musicians in a music stamp series that also may include Buddy Holly and Ritchie Valens.

The Elvis stamp would reward an eight-year campaign by more than 40,000 fans who have conducted a letter-writing campaign in the effort.

U.S. Postal Service spokesman Jim Adams confirmed that Presley and Holly will be part of the series that retiring Postmaster General Anthony Frank announced prematurely Tuesday night on Larry King's national radio talk show.

The Postal Service plans a na-

tional write-in campaign in mid-February to let the public choose which likeness of Presley — a young, thin Elvis "or a more contemporary Elvis" — would be used on the stamp, said Adams.

Musicians included in the series were recommended by the committee but Frank made the final decision, said Adams.

Frank dismissed critics who complained of Presley's death in 1977 of a drug overdose. "Elvis made such tremendous contributions to the musical scene it would be a shame not to include him because of his untimely death on an overdose of legal drugs," he said Tuesday.

Last summer, Frank's endorsement also touched on economic sentiments of the stamp advisory committee: "I predict that, once they do produce an Elvis stamp, it will be the most popular stamp the Postal Service has ever had. It may even raise enough revenue that they won't raise the price of mail."

Among those musicians dead at least 10 years and therefore eligible to be honored in the series along with Elvis are Holly, Valens, Sam Cooke, Jimi Hendrix, Jim Morrison, Janis Joplin, Mama Cass and Otis Redding.

"None of them are the same caliber as Elvis," said Pat Geiger, 72, of North Springfield, Vt., coordinator of the Elvis Presley Postage Stamp Campaign. "This is a slap in the face of Elvis. He deserves a stamp of his own, not part of a series."

communications director, said Graceland has not campaigned for a postage stamp honoring Presley because it would be inappropriate. "It would be like Elvis campaigning to get himself on a stamp," said Morgan.

He said Graceland has always let postal officials know, however, that it supports an Elvis stamp and will "do anything we can to make sure it goes through."

Police called several times Woburn man charged with disturbing peace
