- WHEREAS: The knowledge that all citizens within a community are responsible for the moral fiber of that community, and in a sense are parents in that community, celebration of Respect for Parents Day honors all within that community; and
- WHEREAS: People believe that which they are told about themselves, the recognition of Respect for Parents Day will fortify parents' belief that they fulfill valuable and necessary roles in our society and will enhance their abilities in that role; and
- WEHREAS: The Greek dramatist and great tragic poet of Athens, Aeschylus, believed "Reverence for parents stands written among the three laws of most revered righteousness:" the citizenry of this country also acknowledges this fact; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council does hereby proclaim the first Day of August, each year to be "Respect for Parents Day."
