MAYOR VELLUCCI

- WHEREAS: The safety of buildings we occupy in our everyday lives is essential to the well-being of the citizens of the City of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Among our basic laws and ordinances are those which provide standards for safe construction in the home and workplace; and
- WHEREAS: For building and related construction codes to be effective, understanding and cooperation must exist between code officials and the people they serve-building occupants and all sectors of the construction industry; and
- WHEREAS: The general public often does not recognize the importance of construction safety codes and their effective enforcement until a tragedy may result from unsafe construction; and
- WHEREAS: The contribution made to the health, safety and welfare of our built environment by dedicated professional code officials may not be fully realized by the public at large; and
- WHEREAS: Units of state and local government across the United States-along with such prestigious organizations as BOCA International, the Council of American Building Officials, and the National Conference of States on Building Codes and Standards-are joining to promote safe buildings through the observation of National Building Safety Week; and
- WHEREAS: The theme of National Building Safety Week has been designated as "Building Safety is No Accident"; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby proclaim April 10-16, 1988 as BUILDING SAFETY WEEK in the City of Cambridge, and urge all citizens to recognize the importance of modern construction safety codes and the vital contributions rendered by the dedicated individuals who administer them in the City of Cambridge and elsewhere.
