The Prize is intended to honor the memory of the Laboratory's founder and to increase public awareness of the contributions of engineering and technology to the welfare and freedom of mankind; and
- WHEREAS: The Draper Prize, a gold medal and honorarium, is awarded annually for outstanding achievements in engineering and technology; and
- WHEREAS: The 2001 Recipients of the Draper Prize has been awarded to the inventors and developers of the Internet: Drs. Vinton G. Cerf, Robert E. Kahn, Leonard Kleinrock, and Lawrence C. Roberts; The four recipients each received a gold medallion and citation at Union Station in Washington, D.C. on February 20 and will share the \$500,000 honorarium; and
- WHEREAS: Presentations by Dr. Robert E. Kahn and Dr. Lawrence G. Roberts will be given on May 1, 2001 at 4:00 PM at the Museum of Science, Boston; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council congratulate the 2001 Recipients of the Draper Prize Drs. Vinton C. Cerf, Robert Kahn, Leonard Kleinrock, and Lawrence Roberts and applaud them for their achievements; and be it further
