and he was loved so much.



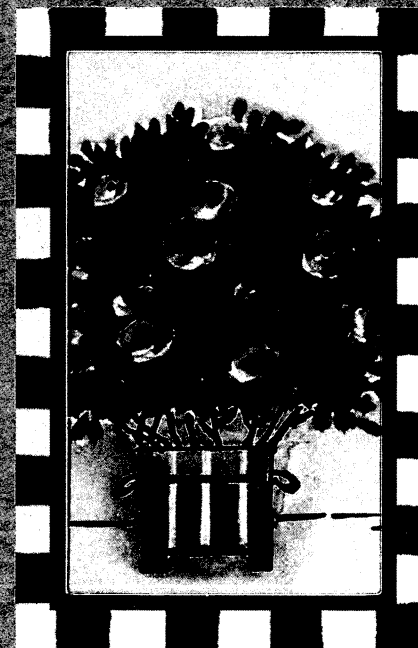
