RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of **Margaret M. Keefe** at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

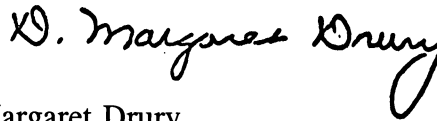

Margaret Keefe of N. Cambridge, 70, retired clerk

Margaret M. Keefe of North Cambridge, a retired clerk for the B & M Railroad in Boston and a former secretary at St. Agnes Church in Arlington, died yesterday at Symmes Hospital in Arlington after a brief illness. She was 70.

Born in Cambridge, Miss Keefe graduated from St. John's grammar school and St. John's High School. She lived in North Cambridge for most of her life.

Miss Keefe worked as a clerk at the B & M Railroad in Boston for more than 25 years. She later worked as a part-time secretary at St. Agnes Church in Arlington for 10 years.

She was a parishoner of St. John's Church in North Cambridge for more than 40 years.

Miss Keefe is survived by two sisters, Mary Dacey of Waltham and Eleanor Tighe of Arlington; a brother, Charles D. Keefe of Arlington; 16 nieces and nephews; and many grandnieces and grandnephews.
