In Board of Aldermen, Feb. 20. 1880

The committee to which was referred the petition of Hovey & others, for the widening of Bridge Street, having attended to the duty assigned them, would respectfully
Report;

That the portion of Bridge St., embraced in the above petition, is at present fifty feet wide;
That, in the opinion of your Committee, there is a public necessity for greater width;
That there are, at present, no buildings of any importance erected upon the Southernly side, so that ~~the~~ widening upon this side would occasion little expense above the land damages.

Your Committee would therefore recommend, that Bridge Street be widened, in accordance with the prayer of the petitioners, from its junction with Cambridge St. to Craigie's Bridge, by taking a strip of land ^{five} twenty feet wide upon the Southernly side, & laying it out as a public high-way & that the usual notice be served upon the abuttors

In Board of Aldermen, March 2. 186 1870.

Whereas it is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that Bridge Street, from its junction with Cambridge Street to the Canal or Craigie's Bridge, should be widened on its Southernly side, in accordance with the Report of the Committee on Roads and Bridges, this day submitted to the Board, so as to be seventy-five feet in width.

Ordered, That a strip of land on the Southernly side of said Bridge Street, extending from the junction of said Street with Cambridge Street to the Canal or Craigie's Bridge, being the strip of land included between the present Southernly line of said Bridge Street and a line drawn parallel with said Southernly line, and at the distance of twenty-five feet and nine inches Southernly from said Southernly line, be taken for public use and laid out as a part of said Bridge Street and a public way, according to a certain Plan drawn by J. E. Chase, City Engineer dated Feb. 14. 1870 and now before this

Bound: on which Plan the present Sutterly line of said Bridge Street is shown by a red line, and the line drawn Sutterly thereof and at the distance of twenty-five feet and nine inches therefrom is shown by a black shaded line, which unites with the Sutterly line of Cambridge Street by a curve of one hundred feet radius.

Ordered, That damages for the land so taken and for the injury to the buildings thereon be estimated and awarded as follows:
