

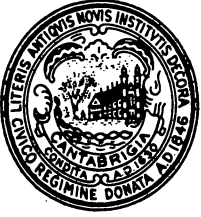



To the Honorable, the City Council:

Pursuant to the City Council's bond authorization for street and sidewalk improvements in non-Block Grant neighborhoods, an appropriation of \$750,000 should be added to the 1979-80 Public Investment Fund. This appropriation will be used to finance improvements to public ways in Cambridge's neighborhoods which are not eligible for Community Development Block Grant funding.
