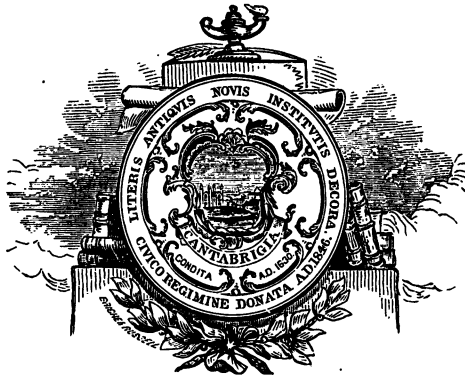

In Board of Aldermen,

Dec. 28. 1874.

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that

Moore Street
be widened and laid out
between Washington St. and Broadway

by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land on *both sides of*
Moore Street
between Washington St. and Broadway

as is included between the *red* lines shown on a plan of *Moore Street*
Street, drawn by the City Engineer, dated *Oct. 19, 1874* and now before this
Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said *Moore*
Street.

Ordered, That damages occasioned by said *widening & laying out* be estimated and awarded as follows:
