WHEREAS: Sergeant Joseph Wilson of the Cambridge Police Department serves as the Neighborhood Sergeant for the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood, working with residents to address neighborhood crime issues; and

WHEREAS: In response to several incidents in 1999 and 2000, Sergeant Wilson worked with Mid-Cambridge neighbors to discuss these incidents and to establish two Neighborhood Crime Watch groups that are very active in the community; and

WHEREAS: As a result of his work in the Mid-Cambridge neighborhood for the citizens of Cambridge, Sergeant Joseph Wilson will be presented with a Special Recognition award at the 2001 Massachusetts Crime Watch Commission on October 15, 2001 at the State House; and

WHEREAS: The Neighborhood Sergeants Program consists of volunteer sergeants and lieutenants, who are assigned full time geographic responsibility throughout the thirteen neighborhoods of the city; and

WHEREAS: These officers meet with their respective community members and leaders on a frequent basis, attend community meetings and several times a year, they coordinate and facilitate police department sponsored meetings within their neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS: Sergeant Joseph Wilson is also an area sector sergeant during his weekly tour of duty. His daily responsibilities include all that comes with the oversight of a platoon of patrol officers handling the variety of situations common to every urban environment; now therefore be it

WHEREAS: The Massachusetts Crime Watch Award is sponsored by The Massachusetts Neighborhood Crime Watch Commission, Governor Jane Swift, Jane Wallis Gumble, Department of Housing and Community Development Director and Michael D. Yacino, Massachusetts Neighborhood Crime Watch Commission Chairman; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council congratulate Sergeant Joseph Wilson on his Special Recognition which is well deserved through his commitment and dedication to the citizens of Cambridge; and be it further

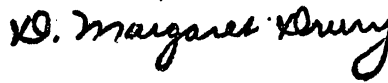
