The United States Government is about to discontinue the use of the large new drill hall recently erected on the Palfrey estate, it is

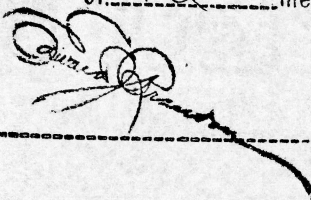
**RESOLVED:**
