Petition of Boston Edison Company for determination by the Department that public convenience and necessity require proposed locations for a line for the transmission of electricity, consisting of two steel pipes and manholes with the necessary wires and cables therein, under and across the Charles River and Soldiers Field road at Cambridge street in the Brighton district of the city of Boston and Memorial Drive at River Street in the City of Cambridge.

This is a petition brought before the Department under the provisions of section 43 of Chapter 92 of the General Laws of Massachusetts (Ter. Ed.) as amended, by the Boston Edison Company, a corporation duly organized under the laws of this Commonwealth, and lawfully engaged in the distribution and sale of electricity in the city of Boston and elsewhere, for determination by this Department that public convenience and necessity require locations in portions of boulevards and reservations in the care and control of the Metropolitan District Commission namely under and across the Charles River and Soldiers Field Road at Cambridge Street in the city of Boston (Brighton) and Memorial Drive at River Street in the city of Cambridge, for two steel pipes and manholes with the necessary wires and cables therein to be used for the transmission of electricity.

A revised plan dated January 29, 1954 showing the proposed locations of the pipes, cables and manholes to be erected and maintained hereunder is on file with this petition.

After due notice, a public hearing at which no one appeared in opposition and investigation of the circumstances, it appears that the locations applied for are necessary for the distribution of electricity to the customers of the Boston Edison Company.

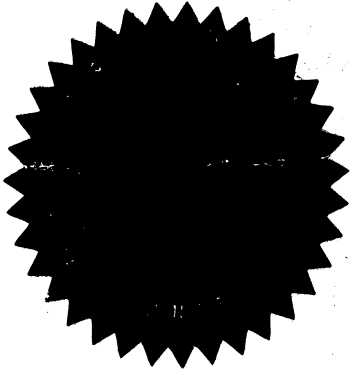
Accordingly, the Department FINDS, by order, after notice and public hearing and consideration that the above described locations as shown on a revised plan above referred to and on file with the petition, are required by public convenience and necessity for pipes, wires, cables and manholes for the transmission of electricity.

Petition of Boston Edison Company for determination by the Department that public convenience and necessity require a grant of locations: to wit, two steel pipes and manholes with necessary wires and cables therein, under and across the Charles River and Soldiers Field Road at Cambridge Street in the Brighton district of the City of Boston and Memorial Drive at River Street in the City of Cambridge, boulevards within the care and control of the Metropolitan District Commission, said locations to be used for distribution of electricity in bulk from its generating station in the City of Everett, through the Charlestown district of the City of Boston and the Cities of Somerville and Cambridge to its substation in the Brighton district of the said City of Boston.

Upon the foregoing petition the Department of Public Utilities will hold a public hearing at its hearing room, 166 State House, Boston, on Tuesday the sixteenth day of February, 1954, at ten o'clock in the forenoon.

And the petitioner is required to give notice of said hearing by publication hereof prior to said date in The Boston Post and to serve a copy hereof by registered mail at least 14 days prior to said date on Mayors and City Clerks of the Cities of Everett, Somerville, Cambridge, Boston and the Metropolitan District Commission and to make return of service and publication at the time of hearing.

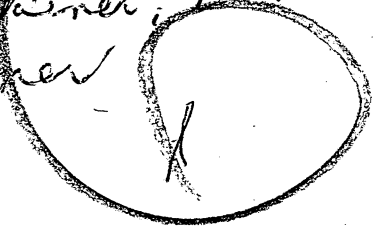
