- WHEREAS: The Bible, characterized by President Andrew Jackson as "the rock upon which our republic rests", and by President Abraham Lincoln as "the best gift God has given to man", has guided the people and the leaders of America from its very beginnings and throughout all its national history; and
- WHEREAS: For forty-nine years, America's business and professional people, men and women of all faiths, banded together in the Laymen's National Bible Association, have sponsored National Bible Week as a time to remind all Americans, whatever their personal faith, of the Bible's unique place in American history; and
- WHEREAS: This annual emphasis has helped to strengthen spiritual awareness throughout America by encouraging personal reading and study of the Bible; and
- WHEREAS: To help men and women realize the cultural importance and personal value of the Bible, the Laymen's National Bible Association has developed nonsectarian literature and public service advertising for the programs of National Bible Week on the theme, "To Know Where You're Going. Read the Bible."; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby proclaim November 19 to 26, 1989, as NATIONAL BIBLE WEEK, in the City of Cambridge, and urge all my fellow citizens to participate in its observance by reading the Bible and in other ways seek to discover the value of the Bible to the life and culture of the United State and its importance for all our people.
