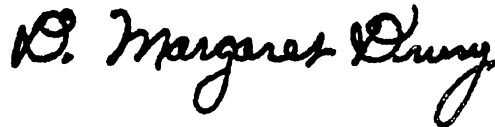

WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of the President Ronald Wilson Reagan on June 5, 2004; and

WHEREAS: Ronald Reagan was a graduate of Eureka College, where he studied economics and sociology; and

WHEREAS: After winning a film contract in 1937, Ronald Reagan appeared in fifty-three films during his career as an actor; and

WHEREAS: Ronald Regan was best known for his role in the 1940 film "Knut Rockne" with his role as "The Gipper"; and

WHEREAS: Ronald Reagan was the President of the Screen Actors Guild from 1947-1952; and

WHEREAS: Ronald Reagan was elected as Governor of the State of California in 1966 and re-elected for a second term in 1970; and

WHEREAS: Ronald Reagan won the Republican Presidential nomination in 1980, and received 489 electoral votes to unseat incumbent President Jimmy Carter; and

WHEREAS: President Ronald Reagan took the oath of Office of the President on January 20, 1981 and thus became the 40th President of the United States of America; and

WHEREAS: It was during his first 100 Days in office that he was shot by a would-be-assassin, but fully recovered to lead the United States over the next eight years; and

WHEREAS: President Ronald Reagan was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1993 by his Vice President and then-President of the United States, George Bush; and

WHEREAS: President Ronald and Nancy Reagan were awarded the Congressional Gold Medal in 2002; and
