Dear Cambridge City Council Members:

At the September 16, 1991 public meeting of the Cambridge City Council, each of you city councilors and your chair, the mayor, received an amended bill (Communications #33) to my June 7, 1990 bill for compensation for my time for developing and implementing an on-the-job training program for your employee, city manager, Bob Healy, on how to perform his duties as the city of Cambridge's cable television license issuing authority and for other reasons, as well.

Because your chair, the mayor, suffers from an extreme case of television-itis, she neglected to refer my bill to the chair of the council's finance committee, councillor Cyr and instead referred the bill to your employee, city manager Bob Healy, who is not a member of councillor Cyr's finance committee and has no power to pay the city's debt to me and is personally responsible for the debt owed me, along with his employees, attorney Philip Sussler and attorney Donald Arman Drisdell, the city's attorney's for the reasons set out in paragraph 3 of my April 17 and April 24, 1990 letters.

THEREFORE: unless city councillor Cyr is not city councillor enough to assert his rights as chair of the city council's finance committee, I urge him, along with his committee, to hear and decide the disposition of my bill (Communication #33).

Regarding my Complaint against city councilor Walsh, (communication #34), forget it.
