RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Feloney family on behalf of the entire City Council.

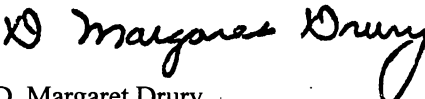

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of The Honorable Lawrence F. Feloney on April 26, 2004; and
- WHEREAS: Judge Feloney was the beloved husband of Theresa (Ciampa); and
- WHEREAS: Judge Feloney was a lifelong resident of Cambridge; he graduated from Cambridge High and Latin School in 1939 and from Harvard College in 1943 after taking leave from Harvard in 1942 to serve in the Army, where he worked at breaking German intelligence codes; and
- WHEREAS: Judge Feloney graduated from Boston University Law School in 1948 and began a long and distinguished public career; he was elected to the Massachusetts House of Representatives in 1952; he left the Legislature in 1962 to serve as legislative secretary to Governor Endicott Peabody; and
- WHEREAS: In 1963 he was appointed as a justice to the Cambridge District Court where he served, including twenty years as Presiding Justice, until retiring in 1991; and
- WHEREAS: As founder and first president of Cambridge and Somerville Program for Alcohol Rehabilitation (CASPAR), Judge Feloney helped thousands of alcoholics reclaim their lives; he was the first judge in the state to appoint a staff member trained in treating alcoholism and his drunken-driving program was in operation a year before the state mandated it; and
- WHEREAS: CASPAR was not Judge Feloney's only humanitarian effort, he was a humanitarian in all of his efforts, in politics, in the courts and in the community; and
- WHEREAS: Judge Feloney's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family and friends, his sons Lawrence F. Feloney, Jr. and his wife Denise and Joseph L. Feloney and his wife Jennipher, his daughter Ann Feloney and his grandchildren Lawrence F. Feloney, III, Kara M. Amy E. and Cameron R. Feloney; and
