In response to Awaiting Report Item No. 34, regarding parking meters in front of residential homes, please be advised that the Department of Traffic & Parking is conducting a study of the locations of parking meters located in front of residences that are in areas zoned for business. At the present time, the only way to install resident parking only is to change the zoning to residential.
