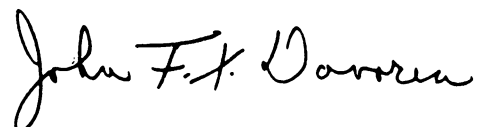

4. Other lawful provisions, if any, for the conduct and regulation of the business and affairs of the corporation, for its voluntary dissolution, or for limiting, defining, or regulating the powers of the corporation, or of its directors or members, or any class of members, are as follows:-

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Code Sec. 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, 26 U.S.C.A. or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law, as the Board of Directors shall determine.

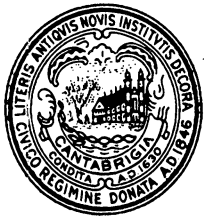
Any such assets not disposed of shall be disposed of by the supreme judicial or superior court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts exclusively for such purposes or to such organizations as said courts shall determine, which are organized and operated for such purposes.

of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation; that the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in, including the publishing or distribution of statements, any political campaign on behalf of any candidate; that notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation organized under Chapter 180 of the Massachusetts General Code including amendments by Chapter 819 of the Acts of 1971, (b) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Code Sec. 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, 26 U.S.C.A. or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law or (c) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Code Sec. 170 (c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, 26 U.S.C.A. or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law.

ATTACHMENT TO AND MADE PART OF THE ARTICLES OF
ORGANIZATION FILED BY GEORGE LEUNG AND HANSON
Y HUANG

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

Exclusively to carry on educational, literary, scientific and charitable purposes or any of them within the meaning of Code Sec. 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, 26 U.S.C.A. or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law, including, for such purposes, the making of distribution to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Code Sec. 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, 26 U.S.C.A. or the corresponding provision of any future United States internal revenue law, the showing of films from or on Asia to the public, and the arranging of panels, discussions, lectures, forums and publications on subjects related to Asia; provided, however, that no part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth above; that no substantial part

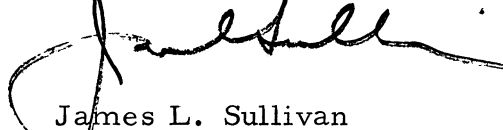
