- WHEREAS: Charles graduated from Boston College in 1924 and obtained his law degree from Harvard University in 1927 and began a long and successful career in law as a Secretary to former United States Supreme Court Justice Felix Frankfurter and also served on the Harvard Crime Commission, where Justice Frankfurter served as Chairman; and
- WHEREAS: Attorney Hamilton served as Legal Counsel to Shubert Enterprises as their representative on theatrical and general property matters for nearly fifty years, a position he truly enjoyed, since he had always been a theater buff and for many years attended every major opening night in the City; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Mary (Barnes) Hamilton and to the entire family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Hamilton on behalf of the entire City Council.

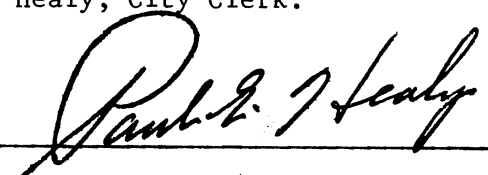
