The Committee on Roads and Bridges, to which was referred the Communication of His Honor, the Mayor, bearing date of November 10th, 1868, in relation to the Draw on West-Boston Bridge, has considered the same and would respectfully

Report.

That, in the opinion of the Committee, a new Draw is greatly needed, as serious difficulties have already arisen within a few weeks in operating the present Draw.

The Committee can see no objection to the course suggested by the Mayor of petitioning the Legislature for the passage of an Act rendering the employment of a Steam Tug compulsory.

As it is too late to give any notice of the intent of the City to present such a Petition and too late to mature any plans for a new Draw, the Committee would recommend that the whole subject be referred

to the next City Council
