Jesse Cody/Cambridge R&L



A sophomore, Cody combined with teammate Everton Morgan to provide a potent attack in what coach Bob Maguire described as a rebuilding year. Cody's fifth-place finish in Division 1 at the EMass championships helped Cambridge to a second-place finish. He ran a strong race at the state meet, finishing fourth in Division 1 and concluded the season by placing 29th as the first sophomore at the Kinney Northeast Regional Meet in New York. He ran a 4:34 mile and 9:55 two-mile as a freshman. His brother Scott, a junior at Providence College, was a Globe Runner of the Year.

The other half of Cambridge's rebuilding project, this sophomore blossomed into one of the state's best cross-country runners in his first year at the sport. He and Jesse Cody complemented each other throughout the season and shared co-championship honors in the Greater Boston League Meet. His best individual effort came at the EMass championships where he placed second in Division 1 behind Lexington's Ted Fitzpatrick. He went on to place fifth in Division 1 at the state meet. As a freshman, he ran a 4:36 mile and a 10:05 two-mile while winning at the Auerbach Meet.

St. John's Prep

This senior earned his

contrived effort to financial fiasco by assigning 20 percent of all winnings to designated charities.
