WHEREAS:

- A. Making sure that the City is a healthy place to live.
- BE. A balanced economy making sure that the City is stabile.
- S. Making sure that the City is a safe place to live.
- A. Making sure that the citizens are aware of the City's conditions.
- F. Making sure that the citizens are treated fairly.

WHEREAS:

Within these guidelines the city government is responsible for the city's present and future planning. M.I.T. by its land aquisitions and business it establishes on the land it purchases is leading the city towards a strictly high tech oriented economy; and

WHEREAS:

Being that the City Council must confront resulting problems of M.I.T.'s action such as disruption of present economies, displacement of lesser income people, loss of affordable housing and possibly the jeopardizing of the city's basic economy due to excessively emphasizing only hi-tech development; now therefore be it

ORDERED:

That the City Council request that the absolute top deciders of M.I.T. land purchasing interest and non-institute business establishings come to City Council and explain in detail future intentions regarding these matters; and be it further

ORDERED:

1. That the Community Development Department give immediate reports to the City Council on any University requests for assistance.
2. That the Community Development Department give a simple annual report to the City Council on the following six matters, who it has helped, what it has done for them, and why, who it has turned down, on what matters, and why; and be it further

ORDERED:

That the City Manager have all city government agencies report any requests for assistance by the universities to the City Council immediately.

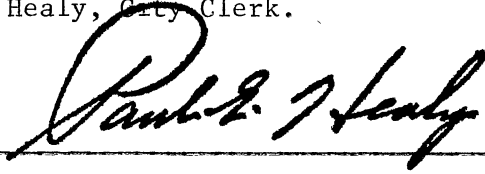
