WHEREAS: A recent serious fire on Agassiz Street underscored the importance of having all streets accessible to extra wide and long fire equipment during the winter months of ice and snow; and

WHEREAS: Only days after the fire, a fire truck seeking to dig out fire hydrants only blocks from the site of the fire on Lancaster Street was unable to get through the street because cars were parked so far from the curb that the passable portion of the street was narrowed enough to prevent access by the trucks; and

WHEREAS: This situation could have been prevented if the portion of the street designated for snow emergency had been cleared and plowed in the week following the last snowstorm; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Fire Department and the Department of Traffic and Parking to ensure that all snow emergency arteries which fall on narrow streets even if not main thoroughfares are cleared and plowed to the curb in the interests of public safety, with a report back to City Council for a new system next year; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to come forward with a plan for cleaning whole blocks in streets, similar to street cleaning plan, to make wholesale snow removal possible.
