- WHEREAS:** This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of James H. Walsh, late President of Walsh Brothers Construction, builders of churches and many educational and medical facilities; and
- WHEREAS:** Many schools were build under Mr. Walsh's direction, including Matignon High School, Archbishop Williams and Boston College High School, as well as having been involved in construction and renovation work at Boston University, Harvard, M. I. T., Boston College, Holy Cross, Emerson and Newton College of the Sacred Heart; and
- WHEREAS:** James was born in Somerville, graduating from Somerville High School in 1914 and from Tufts University, Cum Laude in 1919; and
- WHEREAS:** During World War II James was a Manager of defense installations at Quonset Point, Rhode Island, at Portland, Maine and the old Hingham Shipyard and on coast defense installations on the Boston Harbor Islands; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Walsh family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
