To The Members of the Cambridge City Council:

We are in agreement with Councillor William Walsh's proposal allowing 3 decontrolled units including that of the owner in 4, 5 and 6-unit owner occupied buildings based on vacancy decontrol.

We are retired senior citizens, have lived in Cambridge for over 50 years and have spent all of our working years in the Cambridge workplace.

We purchased our 92 year old 6-unit building in Mid-Cambridge in 1976 and occupy one of the units. Each of the 5 room 3 bedroom apartments rent below the market rate because of the low base rent.

Although not germane to the proposal, a time element for decontrol would be a preferred provision inasmuch as our 5 tenants have a total combined occupancy of almost 60 years in our building. However, vacancy decontrol is a fair concept and would be a step in the right direction to aid small landlords.

Thank you for your consideration to this proposal.

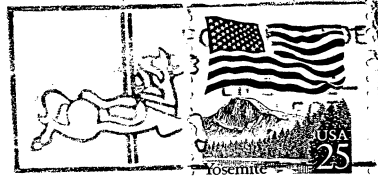

To the Honorable Council:

I am writing today to express my extreme distress over an incident I witnessed today and to inquire as to the city policy on such matters.

I was sitting in Harvard Square this afternoon, enjoying a beautiful spring day on one of the stone benches near the main entrance to the T station. All around me were fellow Cantabrigians, each enjoying the warm weather in their own way. Some were reading, others were chatting among themselves, still others were listening to music with headphone stereos.

This placid scene was disrupted suddenly by a Cambridge police officer. He abruptly told all the assembled people that they had to disperse. He gave no reason, but sounded quite hostile and not interested in any backtalk. One person said, "Is something going on, why do we have to leave?" He responded, "You heard me, move it!"


I looked around me. Was anyone disturbing the peace, or blocking traffic? No. Was anybody skateboarding or playing loud music? No. All around me I saw only people minding their own business in a very peaceable way. I couldn't understand why this was happening.

What I saw next was even more shocking. Rather than force everyone to leave, the officer seemed to be very selective. He ignored me, and another bystander who appeared to be a college student type. Those he insisted move appeared mostly to be primarily minority kids of high school age.

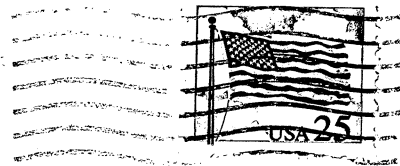
Members of the council, I'm sure I don't have to recount for you the terrible shortage of public spaces in Cambridge, as well as the unique character of Harvard Square as a central meeting place rarely found in cities these days. I'm sure also that I need not state the obvious, that the kind of racist behavior I witnessed has no place in Cambridge.

I merely would like to ask the appropriate authority, whoever that may be, what sort of policy, if any, prompted that police officer to take the action he did, and what possible public purpose could it possibly serve to harass people minding their own business on an otherwise lovely day in Cambridge?

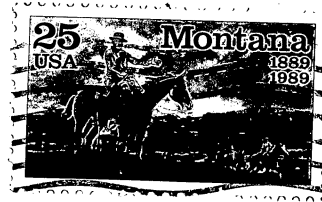


I was pleased to observe that the City Council had requested that the City Solicitor draw up a proposal that would provide some relief to property owners whose homes contain up to five additional rental units. I believe that this is long over due.

Our particular circumstance is that thirteen years ago, as a bachelor, I purchased a single family house that had been hacked into five apartments during the depression. Idealistically I thought that I could use my own knowledge of the building trades to improve the property with "sweat equity" while providing the tenants with a nice place to live at a reasonable price. I was caught completely unaware when the rents began to be rolled back due to the "expiration of capital improvements". Those summer weekends that I had spent scraping, sanding and painting while my tenants vacationed Cape or New Hampshire had been wasted. By the time we were married and had children, the house, valued only as a multiple of its rents, was hardly worth the down payment of a single family house of comparable size. We cannot afford to move and have become the resident servants of our tenants.


With a small house one can hardly afford to hire professional services to do all the projects. Even though most of my life has been organizing and supervising workman on remodelling work, I am alleged by the Rent Control Ordinances to be worth half of what the most untrained laborer gets. As a practicing architect, licensed in Massachusetts 20 years ago, I am allowed to be reimbursed for my time at \$8/hour, and that often to be paid in installments over 15 years.

Although we have always considered ourselves politically moderate and socially liberal, the impingement of Rent Control Ordinances on our life within our own home has gravely embittered us. I hope that you will vote in favor of this proposed small relief.

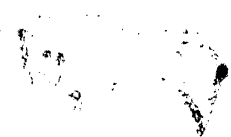

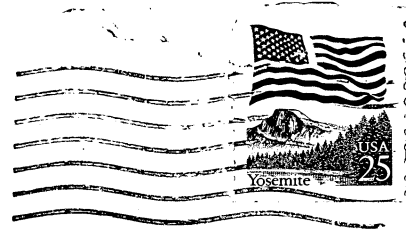

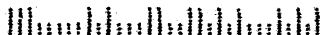

After all the years of rent control, it is plain to see it hardly serves its originally governed purposes.

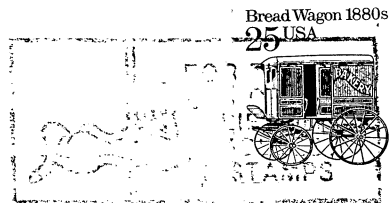
Finally, give us an opportunity to have some closer to-market-value units so that we can, in turn, improve Cambridge's valued resources.


