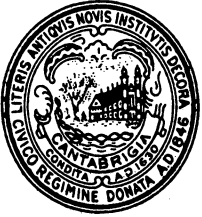

Bottle Bill

Based on the estimates provided by the Environmental Protection Agency, if a Bottle Bill is passed by the State Legislature based on the 8% of solid waste trucked by the Cities and disposed of, it is anticipated that the City of Cambridge could realize a savings in disposal costs of approximately \$50,000, with an additional savings of approximately \$20,000. This amounts to a total of approximately \$70,000 per year. These figures are very preliminary estimates and should a Bottle Bill be passed, these estimates would have to be further studied to determine any actual cost.

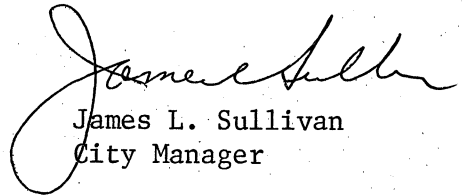
