WHEREAS: The cities and towns in the Metropolitan Water District have proved on many occasions that Water Conservation is a success; and

WHEREAS: The economical use and management of fresh water is an integral part of Water Conservation; and

WHEREAS: All those who use water can conserve water and achieve substantial benefits from reduced water bills, energy bills, sewer use charges, and related water treatment costs; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council do hereby proclaim June 3rd to the 9th, 1984 as WATER CONSERVATION WEEK IN CAMBRIDGE and call upon all citizens and civic organizations to acquaint themselves with the problems involved in providing water and to recognize that a water conservation program offers the most immediate and most cost effective strategy to deal with helping to relieve the burden of excessive water demand.
