

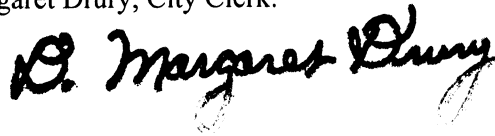
RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy with the Robert Kennedy's family on behalf of the entire City Council.

WHEREAS: Robert Francis Kennedy served his country ably in many different ways, as a Navy seaman recruit, as an attorney general of the United States, as a United States senator from New York; and

WHEREAS: Robert Francis Kennedy played a critical role during the crucible years of the Civil Rights Movement, when he confronted violence surrounding desegregation in our nation's institutions of higher learning in the South, and

WHEREAS: Robert Francis Kennedy spoke eloquently and passionately about the plight of the poor and the disadvantaged in this country; and

WHEREAS: Robert Francis Kennedy showed both courage and honesty in his decision to oppose the Vietnam War while at the same time accepting his role in helping to begin it; and

WHEREAS: Robert Francis Kennedy brought a whole different message to this country during his 1968 campaign by saying, among other things, "We can make an effort, as Martin Luther King did, to understand and to comprehend, and to replace violence with compassion and with love"; and

WHEREAS: Robert Francis Kennedy said that our hope lies in relying on youth, which he identified as "not a time in life but a state of mind"; and

WHEREAS: Robert Francis Kennedy was slain 40 years ago this past week while campaigning for the presidency in California; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council honors the memory of Robert Francis Kennedy, for his work, for his courage, for his words and for his sacrifice, and be it further
