

City of Cambridge.

In the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

An Ordinance,
directing to what uses fines and penalties shall be
appropriated.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City
of Cambridge, as follows:

1. All fines and penalties for the violation
of any ordinance of the city, or any order of the
Mayor and Aldermen, shall, when recovered, come
to the use of the city, and shall be paid into the
city treasury, unless it shall be otherwise directed
by the laws of the Commonwealth or the ordi-
nances of the city.

2. All officers of the city shall enforce
obedience to such laws of the Commonwealth, or
ordinances of the city, and orders of the Mayor and
Aldermen, as it may be the duty of such officers
respectively to observe and enforce; and, to that
end, shall take notice of all complaints, and insti-
tute such prosecutions as shall be necessary for
that purpose.
