WHEREAS: The arts and humanities enhance and enrich the lives of all Americans; and

WHEREAS: The arts and humanities affect every aspect of life in America today including the economy, social problem solving, job creation, education, creativity, and community liveability; and

WHEREAS: Local arts agencies across America have joined with the National Assembly of Local Arts Agencies and a coalition of 42 national arts and humanities organizations representing over 23,000 cultural organizations to form the National Cultural Alliance to develop a multi-year public awareness campaign on the availability and importance of the humanities and arts to all Americans; and

WHEREAS: The campaign and its theme, "The Arts and Humanities: There Is Something In It For You", will be introduced to the public in the Fall of 1993; and

WHEREAS: The nation's 23,000 cultural organizations, the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the nation's 3,800 local arts agencies, the arts and humanities councils of the 56 states in U. S. jurisdictions and the President of the United States will be encouraged to participate in this celebration and in the public awareness campaign; and

WHEREAS: The month of October has been designated as National Arts and Humanities Month; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council urges all mayors to build partnerships with local arts agencies and other members of the arts and humanities community in their cities to proclaim, to participate in, and to celebrate the month of October 1993 as National Arts and Humanities Month.
