D. Elliott, dated Sept., 1875, and now on file in the office of the City Engineer; the easterly line of said avenue to be the red line, and its westerly line to be the blue line, as shown on said plan; and that

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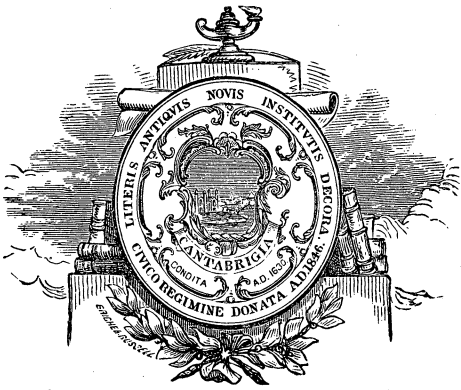
