- WHEREAS: Edward who died in the Massachusetts General Hospital after being struck by an automobile in Charlestown, was employed by Deamo Corporation of Charlestown, and previously to that he worked with Armatron of Melrose for thirty years; and
- WHEREAS: A World War II veteran of both the Army and Air Force, Edward received the Good Conduct Medal, a Bronze Service Star, and the Asiatic Pacific Theatre and American Theatre ribbons, and was also one of the first black pilots and tailgunners; and
- WHEREAS: Edward attended Rindge Technical School and received his high school diploma from the Air Force; and
- WHEREAS: Edward leaves to mourn his bothers Charles, Reverend Earl C., Reverend John D., and Walter; his sisters Helen and Mary Alice; and several nieces, nephews and cousins, all who loved him and will miss him very much; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Green family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Green Family on behalf of the entire City Council.
