MAYOR WOLF

- WHEREAS: Children have inalienable human rights such as the right to food, shelter, health care, education, protection from abuse, and the right to develop in a safe environment free from discrimination; and
- WHEREAS: Children throughout the world face a variety of crises that threaten their proper development; and
- WHEREAS: It is our responsibility to ensure that children receive the level of support necessary for the realization of these rights; and
- WHEREAS: On November 20, 1989, the United Nations General Assembly voted to adopt a new international treaty for the protection of children; and
- WHEREAS: The "Convention on the Rights of the Child" details the civil and political rights of children, as well as social, economic, and cultural rights; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council affirms its support for the Convention on the Rights of the Child, as adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on November 20, 1989; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Council calls on all city agencies--especially those concerned with the housing, nutrition, education, protection, medical care, recreation, and economic opportunity for children--to ensure that, even in increasingly difficult economic times, their programs aim to achieve the goals established at the Convention on the Rights of the Child; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be sent to the Defense for Children International-USA.
