RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Walsh family on behalf of the entire City Council.

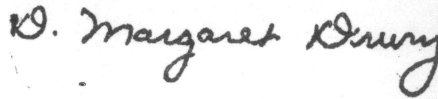

Edward Walsh, former resident of Cambridge, 61

Edward A. Walsh of Port Richey, Fla., formerly of Cambridge, died Wednesday in Florida after a lengthy illness. He was 61.

A longtime resident of Cambridge, he lived in Florida for one year.

Mr. Walsh was employed by the Cambridge Department of Parking and Traffic for more than 30 years before retiring two years ago.

He served in the U.S. Army during the Korean War.

Mr. Walsh is survived by his wife, Joan (Wilson); four daughters, Glenda Coito of North Carolina, Linda Harvey of Cambridge, Donna of California and Deborah of Falmouth; a brother, Thomas Vincent of Cambridge; six stepchildren; and several grandchildren.

A funeral service will be held in Florida.
