- WHEREAS: The City of Boston, due to the construction relative to the depression of the Central Artery has begun a major rodent control problem; and
- WHEREAS: The Major focus of the program will be in the area of the North End, which due to its proximity to East Cambridge, poses the threat of a major infestation, if not dealt with properly; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager direct the Commissioner of Health & Hospitals and the Inspectional Services Department to confer with the proper officials in Boston to coordinate their efforts and together form a "Rat Patrol" that will keep the four legged rodents from invading our city, and if necessary to employ the services of a "Pied Piper" to patrol the bridges and lead them away from our shores.
