- WHEREAS: Thomas A. Scott was born in Washington, D.C., on March 3, 1920, and, in 1926 moved to Cambridge and was educated in our Cambridge School System; and
- WHEREAS: He served his country in the United States Army from March 10, 1941 until December 15, 1945, as a member of the 372nd Infantry; and
- WHEREAS: In June of 1950, he entered the Boston Police Academy, beginning a distinguished career which would include: service in District 10 at Roxbury Crossing; appointment as Detective in 1967; identification, in 1971, with the new Area B as a result of consolidation of Districts 9 and 10; service in the Tactical Police Force (T.P.F.), Districts 14 and 4; and
- WHEREAS: After serving his final tour as a member of the District 4 detail assigned to the Office of the Mayor at Boston City Hall, and completing 35 years of service to the City of Boston, Thomas Scott has retired from police work; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record as congratulating Tom Scott for his respected police work, and extend to him our hope that the years in his life and the life in his years will be many and much for a long time into the future; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to send a duly engrossed copy of this resolution to Thomas A. Scott as an expression of respect from this City Council.
