WHEREAS: Unionized workers of United Parcel Services are currently on strike; and

WHEREAS: UPS employs over 300,000 people in the United States, 185,000 of those employees are represented by the Teamsters Union and over one hundred are Cambridge residents; and

WHEREAS: Unionized UPS workers are seeking increased safety standards, more full-time jobs and an end of the practice of hiring subcontractors; and

WHEREAS: The services provided by UPS have a definitive impact on the day to day operation of many businesses, families and municipal government in the City of Cambridge; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council go on record supporting the Teamsters Union and other unionized workers of United Parcel Services, and urging UPS management to return to the negotiating sessions and offer terms acceptable to the striking workers; and be it further

RESOLVED: That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Teamsters Union Local in Charlestown, Massachusetts, National Teamsters Headquarters, UPS Management in Watertown, Massachusetts and UPS Executive Nationwide Offices.
