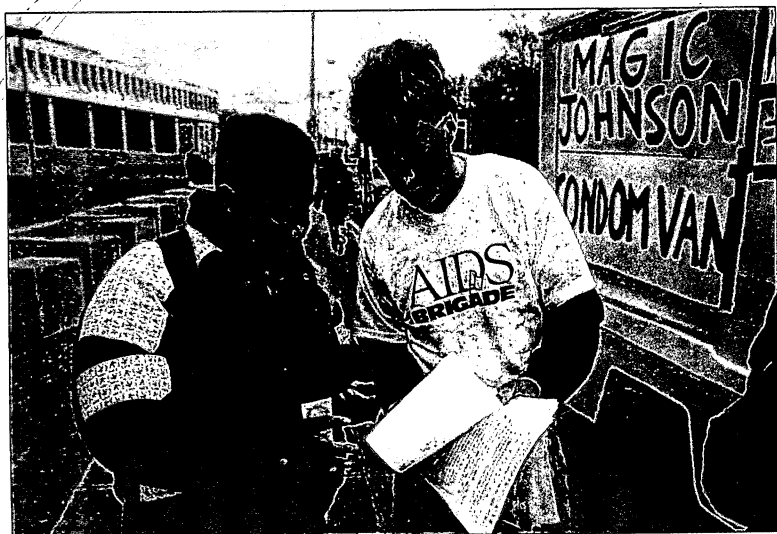

■ Safer Sex: More Preached Than Practiced

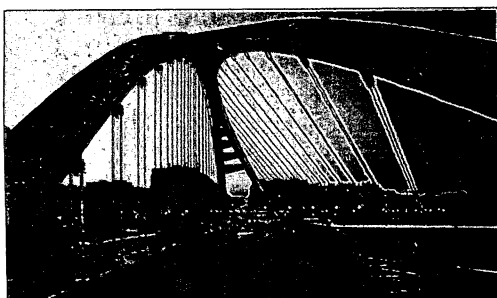

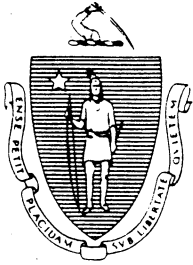

RE: Veterans AIDS Walk Poster

My special programs section has been working with the AIDS Brigade, an organization seeking funding for hospice for veterans with AIDS which will be located in the Mission Hill Community.

Data from the Department of Veterans Affairs indicates that there are currently 10,728 veterans with AIDS under treatment at DVA facilities across the nation, 154 of whom are from Massachusetts. The stark fact is that all 10,728 of these veterans may not survive the next few years.

Those currently with AIDS are equal in numbers to the crews of two fleet aircraft carriers, the entire U.S. Army 1st Division, or one third of the men and women killed in action in Vietnam.

We do not have the data on how many of our veterans population are HIV positive, but tens of thousands are needle and substance abusers, and that most of them could well become victims of AIDS -- a frightening prospect.

I know for many of you this is a difficult issue, but the AIDS Brigade is about dignity in death. One thing is certain, the DVA and this agency are giving our best efforts. Your support and display of the attached poster would help.

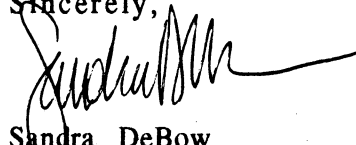
Dear John:
