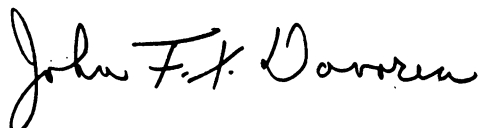

1. The name by which the corporation shall be known is:

XYZ, INC.

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

To establish and maintain a non-profit daycare center for the education and care of children, and pursuant thereto, to receive children for temporary custody during part or all of the day apart from their parents. To encourage and provide for the education and intellectual stimulation, physical well-being, emotional needs of children, and in general to foster the health, well-being and development of children. To acquire, hold, use and dispose of, buy or sell, or otherwise deal in personal property of whatever kind and wherever situated and to hold, purchase, convey, mortgage, and lease such real or personal property, all as may be appropriate to the purposes of the corporation. In furtherance of and not in limitation of the foregoing powers, but only in pursuance of its corporate purposes, this corporation shall have all the general powers conferred by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts now in force or which may be hereafter in force.
