That the City Manager and the Office of Manpower and Economic Development explore all Federal and State manpower development and training funding sources and make application for such funds, as appropriate, in connection with the implementation of the aforementioned program; and be it further

That the City Manager report to this City Council on how the Manpower Program was organized and take the necessary steps to implement this order of the City Council.

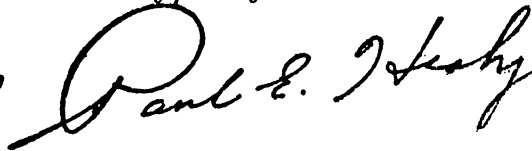

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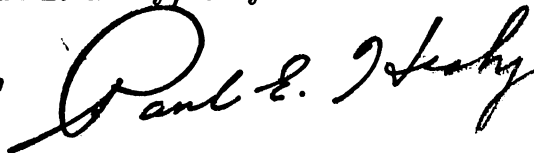
