- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of William A. Edmonds, former Headmaster of the Robert F. Kennedy and Putnam Schools; and
- WHEREAS: Bill, who graduated from Cambridge High and Latin in 1925 and Boston College in 1929, and shortly thereafter received his first appointment to the Cambridge School System, working for many years as a Social Studies Instructor and later became head of the Social Studies Department at CHLS; and
- WHEREAS: Bill was a noted historian, who wrote a book entitled "The History of Cambridge", for which he received the Freedom Foundation Award and the historical papers used for the book are currently stored in the Library of Congress at Valley Forge, Pennsylvania; and
- WHEREAS: Bill Edmonds was a tribute to the teaching profession for his remarkable knowledge and ability to understand children, a personal characteristic which brought him much admiration from among his academic peers; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Beatrice Edmonds and the entire Edmonds family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Edmonds on behalf of the entire City Council.
