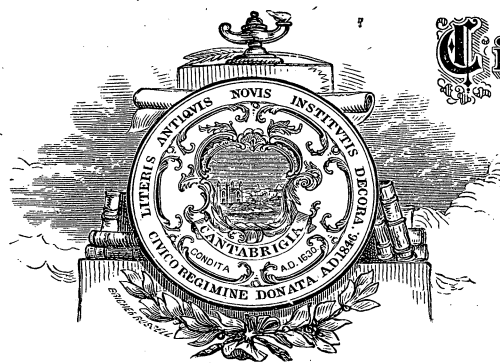

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN, August 7, 1872.

Whereas, certain buildings, steps, bay-windows, and fences, encroach upon the line of Third Street, as shown upon a plan of Third Street on file in the office of the City Engineer; and

Whereas, public necessity and convenience do not at present require the removal of such buildings, but do require the removal of all steps, bay-windows, and fences, encroaching upon the line of said Street, between Thorndike Street and Bridge Street; therefore,

Ordered, That the owners of estates on that part of Third Street above mentioned, be directed to remove all such steps, bay-windows, and fences, within thirty days from the passage of this Order; and the Superintendent of Streets is hereby ordered to remove forthwith all such obstructions, if not removed by the owners within the time above mentioned.

Whereas

Ordered, Certain buildings, steps, ~~and~~ bay windows, ^{and fences,} encroach upon the line of Third Street, as shown upon a plan of Third St. on file in the office of the City Engineer; and

Whereas, Public necessity and convenience do not at present require the removal of such buildings, but do require the removal of all steps, ~~and~~ bay windows, and fences, encroaching upon the line of said street, between Horncliffe Street and Bridge Street; therefore,

Order^d That the owners of estates on that part of Third Street abovementioned, be directed to remove all such steps, bay windows, and fences, within thirty days from the passage of this Order; And the Supt. of Streets is hereby order^d to remove forthwith all such obstructions, if not removed by the owners within the time abovementioned.
