Simon hasn't got time for Boston

After a year of renovations on her Beacon Hill townhouse, **Carly Simon** has decided to move on rather than move in. The four-story house is now on the market for \$3.9 million, the Wall Street Journal reported. The extensive renovations, which city records put at roughly \$1 million, included relocating the kitchen, overhauling the bathrooms, and installing a new slate roof. A spokesman for Simon told the Journal that the singer intended to continue to divide her time between her homes in New York City and on Martha's Vineyard.

Big bucks for small magazines

Two local literary magazines – Ploughshares and Boston Review – have struck it rich, receiving major grants from the Lila Wallace-Reader's Digest Fund. Ploughshares will use its \$125,000 grant to "digitize everything we've ever published," said editor **Don Lee**. And Boston Review publisher **Allison Whittaker** said it will use its \$100,000 grant to add a new section to be called "The New Fiction Forum."

Books on Bistro menu

Hamersley's Bistro is mixing food with literary conversation with a new dinner and book club starting later this month. On four Tuesdays, members of the group will have a meal at the restaurant followed by a discussion of a book

led by its author. The authors – three local and one from New York – and their books are: **George Packer**, "Central Station"; **Sue Miller**, "While I Was Gone"; **Peter Guralnick**, "Careless Love: The Unmaking of Elvis Presley"; and **Arnold Steinhardt**, "Indivisible By Four: A String Quartet in Pursuit of Harmony." The club will have a limited number of members (there are still openings) and the cost is \$235 for the series.

Nice development for writer

Local teacher and author **Patricia Johnson**'s book on photographer **Edward Steichen** was awarded a special commendation (and a \$1,650 cash prize) from the 1998 Kraszna-Krausz Foundation. Given every other year to recognize exceptional books about photography, the London-based foundation's awards this year recognized authors from Germany, Canada, Switzerland, and the United States. Johnson, who teaches at Salem State College, wrote about Steichen's work as a photographer for advertisements and how he changed the marketing of products, particularly to women.

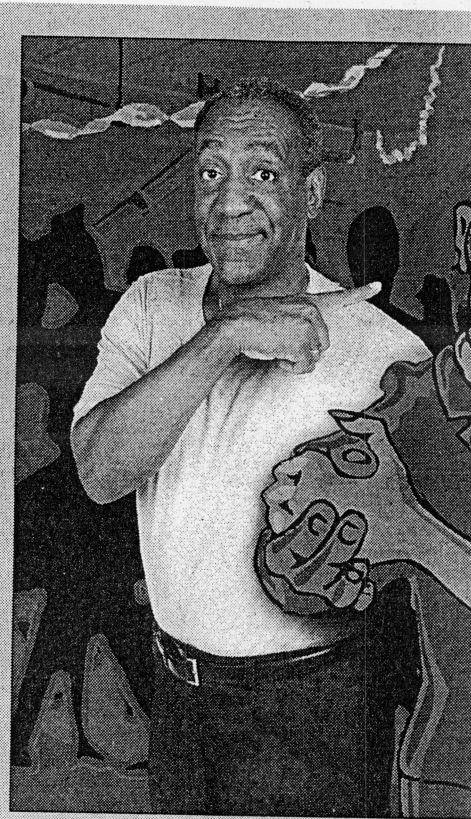
An early Pearl

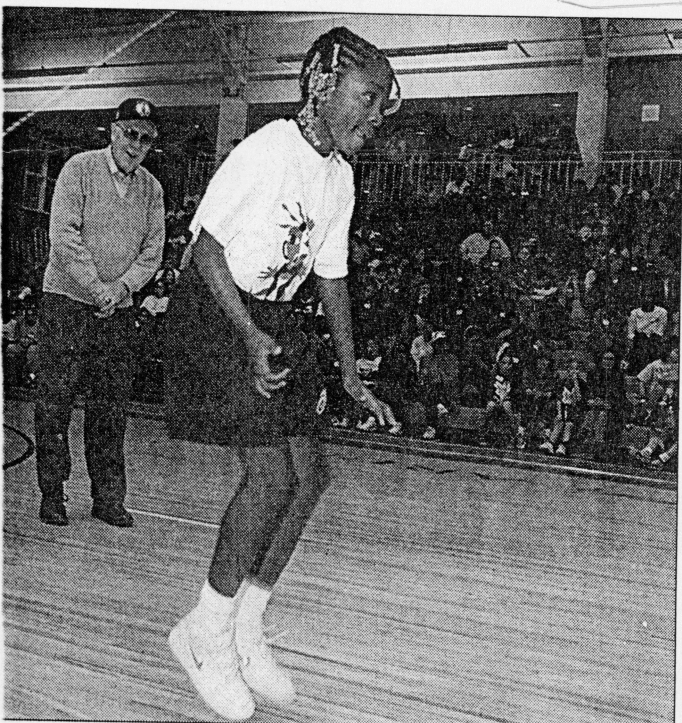


The real Bill Cosby is shown with an ani
