An Ordinance,  
in addition to an Ordinance, establishing the office of  
Superintendent of Streets, and prescribing his  
duties."

Be it ordained by the City Council of the  
City of Cambridge, as follows:—

1. The Superintendent of Streets shall, under the direction and control of the Surveyors of Highways, have the general care and charge of the highways, streets, lanes, sidewalks, and bridges, of the City; and shall attend to the making, amending and alteration thereof, and cause the same to be kept in good repair, so as to be safe and convenient for travellers, with their horses, teams, and carriages, at all seasons of the year. He shall superintend the building and repairing of the drains and common sewers of the City. He shall see that the highways and streets are kept in good order, and that all nuisances and obstructions therein are forthwith removed, or give notice thereof to the Mayor or one of the Marshals of the City. He may, under the direction of the Mayor, make all necessary contracts for the supply of any labor or materials he may require in the discharge of his official duty.

2. The Superintendent of Streets shall have the general care and control of the

teams, carts, and stables, of the city; and he shall, under the direction of the Mayor, before making any other contracts, make any arrangement with the Overseers of the Poor for such supply of labor and materials, as can be furnished by them.

3. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances, inconsistent with the foregoing, are hereby repealed.
