Former mayor of Woburn

Edward F. Gill, a former mayor of Woburn, died yesterday at the Lahey Clinic in Burlington. He was 83.

Mr. Gill was born and raised in Woburn. After graduating from Woburn High School in 1934, he en- tered his family's silversmith busi- ness, the Patrick Gill Co. Inc., which provided articles for churches.

Mr. Gill served in the Air Force during World War II.

After the war, he married Mary F. Crowley and continued in the family business, becoming presi- dent of Patrick Gill Co.

In 1963, he was elected mayor of Woburn, a position in which he served until 1971. Following his mayoral tenure, he returned full time to the silversmith business, where he continued to serve as company president until his death.

Mr. Gill was a member of Ro- tary International, the Knights of Columbus, and the American Le- gion.

He leaves four daughters, Brenda Parisi of Woburn, Carol Iannacchino of Wilmington, Denise Davy of Billerica, and Marylou Gill Fierro of Ipswich; two sons, Ed- ward F. Jr., of Andover, and Kevin of Woburn; and nine grandchildren.

ORDER ADOPTED
