### 'Women on the Homefront'

The Cambridge Women's Heritage Project is hosting an event called "Women on the Homefront." The event highlights women and patriotism, remembering the war efforts of the women in Cambridge during World War II. The public is invited to attend this free program. It will be held Monday, Dec. 3, from 1 to 2:30 p.m. at the Cambridge Senior Center, 806 Massachusetts Ave., Central Square.

A panel of five women will share their stories of how they contributed to the war efforts. Their stories will exemplify how women can bond together and accomplish remarkable

things. These women will describe what civilian women's roles were at home in Cambridge and abroad.

Audience members will be encouraged to share their own stories about what they did to help the war efforts. The audience can participate in a remembrance of the past. The young will be able to hear history firsthand and the older generation will be able to tell its account. There will be displays of women's homefront memorabilia. This memorabilia will include, but will not be limited to, medals, jewelry, photographs, and even wartime cookbooks and utensils.

Jill Carni, a member of the Cambridge Women's Heritage Project, is organizing the Women on the Homefront program. She is a jewelry historian who committed herself to the project in 1998. Her passion for women's history and her energy are helping to drive this program. The intent of the program is to provide a structure in which people of all ages can participate in a remembrance and tribute to women and the roles they played during World War II.

The Heritage Project is hosting the event and the Cambridge Women's Commission is sponsoring it. The Women's Commission is an organization that focuses on increasing the awareness of women's issues and in ensuring the equal status of women in society. The Cambridge Women's Heritage Project is a committee, co-sponsored by the Women's Commission and the Cambridge Historical Commission, with the goal of researching and cel-

ebrating Cambridge women's history.

The research will enable the project to develop biographical entries for a women's heritage database and for use on a future Web site. The information collected will further be used to form a Cambridge women's heritage trail.
