- WHEREAS: In 1972 the legislature enacted M.G.L. Chapter 40, Section §8G which empowers a city which has accepted the statute to enter into an agreement with one or more other cities or towns to provide mutual aid programs for their police departments to increase the capability of such departments to protect the lives, safety, and
- WHEREAS: There are occasions when events occur which may involve the need for interaction and cooperation with neighboring communities, and the authority to enter into mutual aid agreements would enhance the City's ability to protect the lives, safety and property of the people of Cambridge; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the City Council hereby accepts the provisions of Chapter 40, §8G of the Massachusetts General Laws, authorizing agreements with other cities and towns to provide mutual aid programs for police departments.

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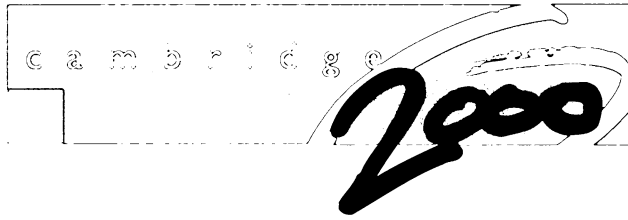

To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am transmitting a proposed order for the acceptance of M.G.L. c. 40, §8G. As the proposed order indicates, acceptance of this statute would permit the City to enter into agreements with other communities to provide mutual aid programs for the Police Department to increase its capabilities to protect the lives, safety, and property of the citizens of Cambridge. Such agreements would provide particularly helpful in responding to events, which occur partly in Cambridge and partly in surrounding communities.

I recommend acceptance of the statute to provide additional options for the City to respond to these particular events.
