Dear Friends,

I am writing to invite you to join me and your Eitz Chayim friends on Magazine Street this Sunday (June 11). We have a wonderful project going and I know you'll want to be a part of it. Called "**MOMS**" (for **Miracle on Magazine Street**), it has already created a minor miracle. At last Sunday's "Prep Day," an incredible amount of work was done which has magically transformed our yard into a different place.

This Sunday we will be landscaping, planting, painting and celebrating. Elivia Sagov is going to work with the children to create a mural on the wall facing the side yard. **Children** are encouraged to work on the mural with Elivia, to work alongside their parents on another part of the project or, if they are little (8 or under), to be dropped off at child care.

Information for the Day: We'll begin at 8 a.m. and stop work at 5 p.m. Come when you can and stay as long as you want. Come for 2 hours! Or spend the day!

CHILDCARE will be presided over by Adalicia & Robert Roth. Children must be **signed in** and out and **parents must remain on the premises**. Childcare providers will take a lunch break during which time children must be with their parents.

FOOD! Breakfast, Lunch, Snacks & more will be provided. We have had many wonderful donations from local restaurants and stores. Mmmmm yummy treats! Starting between 5:30 and 6 a **Celebration Dinner** will be served. Stay and celebrate all that we've done. If you work early in the day & have to leave, come back at the end for the **PARTY!**

ENTERTAINMENT! The Wholesale Klezmer Band, with our own Sherry Mayrent, will provide joyous music to accompany our work. Their delightful music will cheer and energize us. You won't want to miss them!

What Will Be Accomplished:

What we can do depends on two things: **volunteer time** and **donations** (of money or bushes, plants, playground equipment, etc). Whether you are able to be with us on Sunday or not, it is not too late to make a donation. A donation of "chai" would help us put lattice along the side fence. \$25 could add an evergreen to the foundation plantings, and who knows, perhaps even help start a Biblical Garden (northern style). Can you give \$100? This would help us to plant grass and put in benches and tables for conversation and contemplation. Can you give more? Good playground equipment costs more than we thought and we'd love to be able to buy some.

Will you help? The labor is all volunteer and donations of time and money determine how much we'll have to work with and how much will get done. 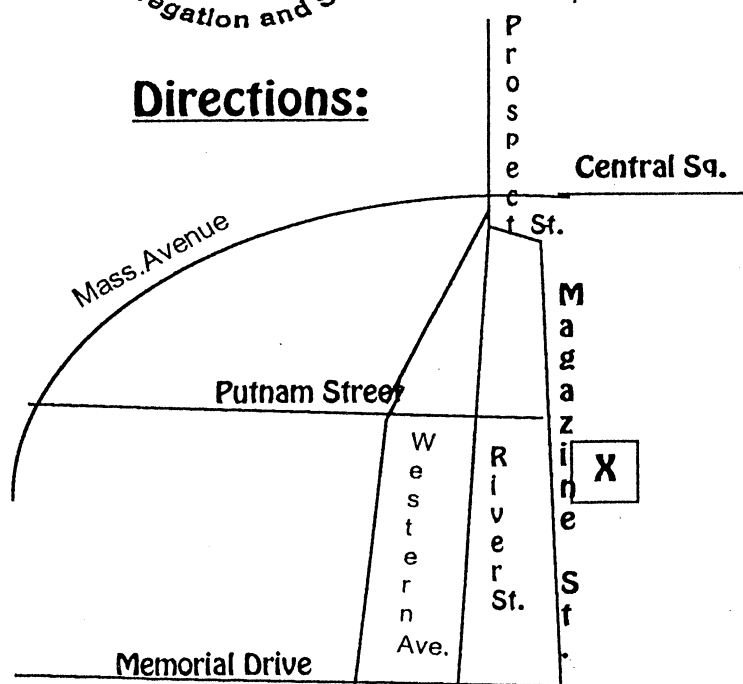
