To the Honorable, the City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of a grant from the Massachusetts Department of Public Health for \$7,000 to the Grant Fund Fire Department Extraordinary Expenditures account.

This grant would allow the Fire Department to purchase additional equipment for the two mass decontamination units-\$3,500 each. A mass decontamination unit is a large tent-like deployment system that injects bleach or soap into a self contained water supply to start the decontamination process in case of a radiological, biological or chemical event. These decontamination units will also assist hospitals contain a group of people that may have been contaminated.
