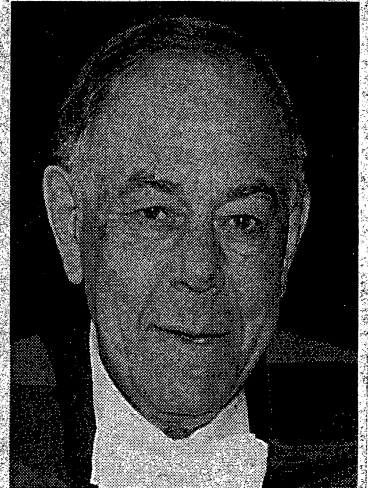
Sanford J. Fox, 70, law professor and expert on children's rights

A memorial service will be held today for Sanford J. Fox of Brookline, an expert on children's rights who taught at Boston College Law School for 40 years.

Mr. Fox died of complications of heart disease Saturday in Brigham and Women's Hospital. He was 70.

He was the former chairman of the American Bar Association's committee on the rights of children and served on the governor's board for the organization's Center on Children and the Law. He served on a presidential commission on law enforcement and the administra-

tion of justice, and was a member of the Massachusetts Crime Commission that investigated corruption and abuses in state government in the early 1960s.

John H. Garvey, dean of BC Law School, described Mr. Fox as "an important scholar, a fearsome advocate for the rights of children, and a man of great moral and intellectual integrity."

Mr. Fox was born in Brooklyn, N.Y. He graduated from the University of Illinois and Harvard Law School.

After serving in the Navy, he joined the faculty at BC in 1959. He was a visiting professor at the University of Texas and the University of Paris.

Mr. Fox was the author of "Science and Justice, the Massachusetts Witchcrafts Trials," published in 1969. He recently was working on a Web site that would inform children of their rights under domestic and international law.

He leaves his wife, Vivian (Daitz); two sons, Gregory of Los Angeles and Michael of Columbus, Ohio; a daughter, Diana, of Providence; and a sister, Lenore Bumstead of Sarasota, Fla.

The memorial service will be at 4 p.m. in Stanetsky Memorial Chapels in Brookline.
